Mapping Brain Health and Dementia Research Across Canada

Dr. Juanita-Dawne Bacsu and her team of researchers were recently awarded a grant by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research - Institute of Aging to lead a national project aimed at mapping brain health and dementia research across Canada to identify gaps, existing evidence, and areas for innovation. This comprehensive project includes an environmental scan of dementia research centers, a scoping review of reviews, and focus groups with members of the Dementia Research and Innovation Funders Alliance ("the Alliance") in Canada. The project builds on the 2019 National Dementia Strategy, which laid the groundwork for advancing prevention, treatment and diagnosis, and quality of life for people with dementia. Through this work, the team will develop actionable insights to support innovation and strategic collaborations to advance dementia research in Canada. The team will share preliminary results at the Canadian Consortium on Neurodegeneration in Aging's Conference this October, followed by a presentation to the Alliance this November.

Addressing Stigma of Dementia on Social Media Workshop

The PHARR Centre hosted a workshop on May 14th, 2025 to explore strategies for addressing dementia-related stigma on social media. Funded by the Alzheimer Society of B.C. and MSHR, the event brought together people with lived experience, community leaders, health professionals, and policy makers to challenge online misinformation and stereotypes. The workshop featured panel discussions, poster presentations, and collaborative sessions to identify innovative strategies for addressing dementia-related stigma on social media. The workshop's findings will be disseminated through a report, a journal publication, and a video.
